COURSE DESCRIPTION

A survey of Christian approaches to the field of counseling focusing on: paradigms and models, how they compare, and how these strategies can be implemented in ministry.

PURPOSE STATEMENT

The purpose of this course is to present the student with a study of the background, content, and unique characteristics of Christian counseling. This course will communicate major roles and counseling skills of a Christian counselor.

OBJECTIVES

Students should be able to:

1. Apply the basic concepts of Christian counseling in formal or informal settings with the counselee
2. Model Christ-like behavior (love, patience, self-control, etc.) while acting as a change agent in helping others experience transformation
3. Distinguish between Christian and secular counseling, and how the two can be integrated in the counseling process

Name: Introduction to Church Management

Description:

DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE OF COURSE:

This course provides an overview of the fundamentals of church administration and management of non-profit organizations. The course is designed for church leaders to study church business concepts and basic administrative practices to enhance the vision and ministry of the church.

The Course aims to educate students on all aspects of church management. It will touch core concepts such as servant leadership, volunteer management, facilities management, financial processes, budgets, fundraising, strategic planning, risk management, government regulations, constitution and bylaws, tax and legal issues, policies and procedures, pastoral/staff compensation and benefits.

COURSE COMPETENCIES AND LEARNING OBJECTIVES

After completion of this course, students should be able to:

1. Understand and apply biblical principles about church administration.
2. Define terms, policies, and operating procedures associated with Church administration and nonprofit organization management.
3. Identify the roles and responsibilities of the pastor, board, and officers for the financial management of the local church.
4. Develop a church budget, analyze financial reports, and implement financial processes for the church.
5. Identify and Implement management principles, procedures, and techniques to improve the effectiveness of the local church's operations.
6. Develop an understanding of the various areas of church administration including personnel, finance, legal, property management, risk management, technology and appropriate protocols and policies for each area.
